

A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT

As mentionned earlier, the year 1990 marks the fifth anniversary of AMAN'S incorporation (April 1985). At that time, large family associations incorporated in the Province of Quebec set at about 1000 their desirable membership list. For most associations, annual dues were set at about 10\$ but raised since. Those created recently charge as much as 20\$.

AMAN has surpassed the 1100 membership figure after 1987, the year of its first north american Mercier "rassemblement" in mid August at Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré. Since that event, the Association's membership has rapidly decreased by more than two thirds and staggers presently at the 400 figure. It is, however, on the upward trend.

The late 1989 recruiting campain has yielded good results. Many members had simply forgotten to send their annual dues. THANKS to both, the ancient and new members. Several of them want to receive regularly from the secretariat a notice regarding the payment of their membership dues. AMAN's directors have unfortunately been forced to accept this costly recommendation. They also have agreed to pay one dollar annually per member to the "Fédération des familles souches québécoises inc." It is greatly needed to assure the most essential services offered by the Federation. Furthermore, your directors have decided to return a portion of the recruiting fee and annual dues to Regional Committees in order to help AMAN reaching as soon as possible the 1000 membership target.



MERCIER PIONEERS: FROM "SAINT-JOACHIM-DE-BEAUPRÉ" TO "LA CÔTE-DU-SUD"

Descendants of Paschal and Jean Mercier, two of the five (5) sons of the ancestral couple Jullien Mercier and Marie Poulain, have cultivated land in "Saint-Joachim-de-Beaupré" before farming on the south shore of the Lawrence River at "Berthier-en-Grève" and "Saint-François-du-Sud" after the year 1709.

At the occasion of its fourth General Annual Meeting held in Saint-François-du-Sud" on sunday August the twentieth 1989, AMAM has handed a memorial plaque to the Maurice Mercier Family of "Berthier-sur-Mer" (Cf Le Mercien, volume 5, number 4, October 1989, page 10). This Mercier of the tenth north american generation owns a farm

bought in 1706 by J. Pascal Mercier, the senior of the three sons of Paschal land Anne Cloutier of "Saint-Joachim-de-Beaupré" and transmitted from father to son for over 280 years. AMAN reproduces below the remarks by its past President Ernest at the occasion of the unveiling of the commemorative plaque.

In an article entitled "Petite histoire de Berthier-sur-Mer", published in 1973 in the number 8 issue of the Annals of the South Shore Historical Society, Father Robert Lavallée of the White Fathers of Africa writes, on page 10, as follows:

"Alexandre Berthier was born in Bergerac in french province of Gascony. He was born a Calvinist but became a Catholic in 1672. On the 11th of October of the same year, he married Marie Le Gardeur de Tilly in Québec. Soon after that initiated the date, hesettlement of the seigniorial domain bygranting tracts of land to of some the veteran who had served soldiers under him, but mainly, we told, to sons of born colonists in this country, among whom Paschal Mercier, born in Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré and Pierre Blé (Blais) born in St. Jean, Isle of Orléans."

We may recall that Alexandre Berthier held the rank of captain in the regiment fo Carignan. The Intendent Talon granted him, on 29th of October 1672, a seigniorial domain comprising the fiefdom previously conceded to Marsolet plus a cosniderable of tract additional adjacent to it. This new seigniory of Bellechasse situated south shore of the St.Lawrence River, is bounded on the west by the Seigniory La Durantaye and on the east by the Seigniory de la Rivière-du-Sud. seigniory of Bellechasse comprises the territory currently occupied bythe parishes of and Berthier-sur-Mer Saint-François; that of Rivière-du-Sud, the town of Montmagny and the village of Saint-Pierre-du-Sud.

Paschal Mercier, Sr.

Who is this Paschal Mercier,

born in Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré? He was the eldest of five (5) sons born to the pioneer couple of Jullien Mercier and Marie Poulain, established on Côte-de-Beaupré since 1651. Paschal farmed, since the 30th of July, "hilly tract of land situated in the parish of Saint-Joachim-de-Beaupré." At the age of 25, on November 11th, 1681, at Chateau-Richer, he is wed to Anne Cloutier, daughter of Jean Cloutier and Marie Martin. (Ref.: Mercier depuis siècles, 1987). He died on October 25th, 1695 at the age of 39 and was buried in Chateau-Richer.

Pascal Mercier, jr.

While Paschal Mercier, Sr. had refused to accept the offer of the owner of the Seigniory of Berthier-Bellechasse, his three sons did not follow his example. In 1709, they were no longer in possession of the lands of their parents had left them on the "Côte-de-Beaupré". The eldest the three, Pascal Mercier, purchase on the 13th of July, 1706, from Joseph de Blois and Marguerite Rousseau (before Etienne Jacob), in the above mentionned seigniory a lot of land measuring 3 by 42 arpents and situated between lands of Pierre Blay (Blais) on the east and lands of Jacques Beaudoin on the west.

There is, at present, approximately one kilometre west of the church of Berthier-sur-Mer, a road bearing the name of Pascal Mercier. It leads from the main artery (Rte 132) to the site of the original church erected on by the pioneer owned settler Pierre Blé (Blais) in 1719. The piece of land formerly owned byPascal is situated approxi-Mercier mately one hundred (100) metres west of the road which bears his The original ancestral name. home has been moved from the

riverside (original king's road) to its present site one kilometre to the south, following the general trend of the parish of Berthier-sur-Mer in 1859.

The canonical decree of Mgr. de St-Vallier, establishing the parish of "Berthier-en-Grève" and dated September 20th, 1721, mentions the names of the three Mercier Brothers, Pascal, Pierre and Jean, as well as those of Nicolas de Rigauville, Louis Beaudoin, Joseph Lemieux, Pierre Blais, Antoine Blais, Jacques Bilodeau, Antoine Bilodeau, Jacques Beaudoin and Jean Boutin.

The "habitant" tradition of the Merciers' of Beaupré

The facts previously reported provide ample proof of the attachment the profound descendents of the pioneer couple Jullien Mercier and Marie Poulain of New France felt for the land. It is not surprising. Jullien was the grandson of Marin Mercier, Jeanne labourer, and marriage took whoseBrisson, place in Grand-Pré-de-Tourouvre in December 1571. The pioneer ancestor, Jullien, born raised in a rural environment, Québec as came to labourer. After his landing on August 1647, he worked during three years for the Jesuits in their seigniory located on the east side of the St.Charles In 1651, he started to clear a lot of land at Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré. Two of his sons Saint-Joachim-desettled at lands of limited Beaupré on They were, however, fertility. in transmitting to successful their offsprings their love of land and the legitimate desire to possess ultimately the best farms on the South shore of the St.Lawrence River.

OTHER MERCIERS AT "BERTHIER-EN-GREVE" AND "SAINT-FRANCOIS-DU-SUD"

In the declaration and census of his Seigniory that Nicolas Blaize des Bergères, husband of Françoise Vianney Pachot, widow of Alexandre Berthier Ecuier and Lord of Villemure, presented to the Intendent Begon, on August the eight 1724, the Lord of Berthier-Bellechasse describes the lands exploited by the three sons of the couple Paschal Mercier and Anne Cloutier.

At that time, Pascal, Pierre and Jean Mercier were farming lands at "Berthier-en-Grève".

the According to Catalogne, king's official cartographer, Paschal Mercier's heirs had sold, before 1709, the lands that their father had bought from Charlotte Godin, widow of Pierre Frichet known as Brulot of Saint-Joachimde-Beaupré, on July the thirtieth 1680 (before Duquet).
