Sites et généalogie --- Sites and genealogy

Le Service de généalogie de l'AMAN entreprend, en 1992, des recherches intenses sur les descendants du couple ancestral Charles Mercier dit Lajoie et Marianne Lahayse. Le but principal de cette étude laborieuse est de répondre à plusieurs demandes de francophones et anglophones Mercier (des États-Unis, en premier lieu et du Canada en second lieu), qui veulent connaître leurs racines en territoire nord-américain.

L'agencement de la descendance du couple ancestral précité n'est pas facile du fait que des descendants de trois des cinq couples ancestraux Mercier établis en Nouvelle-France avant 1770 prenaient et prennent encore conjoint dans les paroisses de la partie sud du comté de L'Assomption, Qc. De plus, quelques descendants de l'un de ces trois couples ancestraux Mercier, dont le patronyme était alors Mercier dit Lajoie ont pris un conjoint dont le nom de famille était, à l'époque, soit Janot ou Jeannot dit Belhumeur

ou dit Lachapelle, soit Juneau dit Latulippe. Quel imbroglio de patronyme!

Pour le moment, la question est de savoir si Joseph (Lajoie) Mercier (fils de Charles et Marianne Lahayse) marié avec Catherine Janot dit Lachapelle (fille de Dominique et Marie-Rose Archambeault), à Repentigny (L'Assomption) le 17 novembre 1800 est bien le père de François Mercier? Ce François que l'on identifie comme fils de Joseph Lajoie Mercier et de Angélique (?) Jannot a épousé Victoire Therrien (fille de Pierre et Marie Hamelin) à Repentigny le 3 novembre 1829. Est-ce que Catherine Janot avait aussi Angélique comme troisième prénom?

Le tableau généalogique donne le conjoint, la date et le lieu de mariage pour les deux premières générations issues du couple Charles Mercier dit Lajoie et Marianne Lahayse. Il est incomplet. Le Service de généalogie de l'AMAN accueillera avec joie toute suggestion qui aiderait à le compléter.

The AMAN'S Genealogy Service is undertaking intensive research on the ancestral descendance of the couple Charles Mercier known as Lajoie and Marianne Lahayse. The aim of this elaborate study is to answer numerous inquiries from english and french speaking Merciers (from USA mainly and from Canada) who would like to know more about their roots in North-America.

The descendance of the fore mentioned couple is not easy to trace because descendants of three of the five ancestral Mercier couples established in New-France before 1770 were and are still taking spouse in the parishes in the southern part of L'Assomption (Qc). Furthermore, some descendants of one of those three ancestral Mercier couples, whose patronymic (family name) was then Mercier known as Lajoie took spouse whose family name was, at the time, either Janot or Jeannot known as Belhumeur or Lachapelle, or Juneau known as Latulippe. What a patronymic imbroglio!

For the time being, the question to solve is to know if Joseph (Lajoie) Mercier (son of Charles and Marianne Lahayse) married to Marie Catherine Janot known as Lachapelle (daughter of Dominique and Marie-Rose Archambault), in Repentiony (L'Assomption), on november 17th, 1800 is without a doubt the father of François Mercier? This François, identified as son of Joseph Lajoie Mercier and Angelique (?) Jannot was married to Victoire Therrien (daughter of Pierre and Marie Hamelin) on november 3rd, 1829 in Repentiony. Did Catherine Janot Angelique as third christian name?

The genealogical table below gives the spouse's name, date and place of marriage of decendants of the first two generations issued from Charles Mercier knows as Lajoie and Marianne Lahayse. It is incomplete and the Genealogical Service would joyously accept any rectification to achieve it's completion.





1. Genealogy workshop

If franco-americans descendants of Québec ancestral couples want to retrace their roots, they must endeavor to supply genealogists the date and place of marriage of their mother and father, their grandparents and great grandparents if possible. Baptism or birth certificate may be useful but the christian names may have been non officially modified during the period in between birth and wedding.

2. General assembly

AMAN decided in 1989 to publish its liaison publication in Canada's two official languages (french and english). To the AMAN's leader its a question of giving the members of our association an appreciated service as well as creating an opening to external world. This is a service to the Mercier's of Canada and the United States of America.

English, due to its simplicity, is progressing slowly in becoming the universal language. More than 80% of scientific articles on agronomy -My own field of workare publish in english papers. French would problably have become the international language, had it not been fo the divorce in between ENGLAND and FRANCE in 1429. Actually Spanish -- because its clarity and logic -- is gaining ground as the second most used language of the world. French should keep the third place. Fortunetaly, French supplied, due to its greek-latin origin and its logic, approximately half of the english vocabulary.

It is the use by military forces, the technologic and economic communities that determine the world rank of a language.

If some franco-americans desire to retain the French as a second language their the only one that can make it so. In democracy when the peoples speak, the political power listens, hears and follows. Ernest Mercier

Distinctions honorifiques -- Honorary Decorations

In december 1990, Lt-colonel Denis Mercier of Quebec was awarded the rank of officer of the **Canadian Military Order of Merit**. The ANAM which, at the time, congratulated him on his achievements is proud to write the biographic notice of this young soldier whose merits are not awaiting the years.

Lt-colonel Denis Mercier was born in Sherbrooke. After completion of his collegiate studies at the Mont Saint-Louis College, in Montreal, he enroled in the Canadian Armed Forces in september 1965. First posted to the Royal Military College of St-Jean (RMC St-Jean) he graduated from RMC Kingston with a diploma in Engineering and Management in 1970.

Posted in september of the same year to the 12th Armoured Regiment of Canada (12th ARC), to which he is still affected, he successively serves as troop commander, administration officer and instructor, In january 1974 he is detached to the 12e Regiment de Chasseur de Sedan in France. During this detachment he follows the captain's course at Saumur and receives the Staff officer of the French Ground Forces.

Recalled to Canada during the summer of 1976, he serves as the 12th ARC regimental adjutant for a period of two years of which six months were with the Canadian contingent of the UNO in Cypress.

He then serves successively as "C" Squadron 12th ARC commander, trainee at the Canadian Staff College and staff officer with the 5th Canadian Brigade Group in Valcartier.

Promoted to the rank of Major in february 1980 he is a student of the Canadian Armed Forces Staff College in Toronto from august 1980 to july 1981. Back with the 12th ARC he commands a squadron until his detachment for Saumur,

France in the summer of 1983 were he serves as an instructor at the school "École d'application de l'arme blindée et de la cavalrie".

Back in Canada in the summer of 1985 he is posted as staff officer Canadian Militia Eastern Sector in Montreal. He was named 2nd in command to the 12th ARC for a period of three years in 1987.

Promoted to the rank of Lt-colonel in july 1990 he takes command of the Reconnaissance Regiment of the 1st Canadian Division in Kingston.

In december 1990 Lt-colonel Denis Mercier is awarded the rank of officer in the Canadian Military Order of Merit.

Married to Ghislaine de Vastey, he has a son Philippe, (eighteen years old), and two daugthers, Noémi and Marianne, respectivly thirteen and fifteen years old. They live in Quebec city.

ERNEST MERCIER, Ph.D.

1914 —

Throughout his career as a researcher, superintendent, deputy minister of agriculture and private consultant, Dr. Ernest Mercier has been instrumental in planning and implementing provincial and federal agrifood policies required in transforming the family farm into a viable and profitable enterprise in Quebec. Dr. Mercier worked towards modernizing marketing legislation to enable farmers to regulate their own production in Quebec and Canada; making basic farm loan and credit available to all efficient family farm owners in Quebec; improving the transfer of scientific research results to agrifood producers in Canada and the world and having producers take responsibility for managing several farm improvement services.

Some highlights of Ernest Mercier's contributions to agriculture include his post-graduate research on the influence of day length on reproduction efficiency and the shape of the lactation curve of dairy cows in Canadian latitudes (1945-47); the organization of the

Quebec Artificial Insemination Centre in 1947 and the initiation of Quebec's Dairy Herd Analysis Service which became an important semi-privatized dairy cattle improvement program (1965). He also initiated the semi-privatization of Quebec's extension services after studying the close relationship between research, teaching and extension in New York State and the privatization of extension services in France.

Dr. Mercier served as a special advisor to CIDA and as a member of Canadian delegations to FAO and other international conferences. He was also a member of several missions to developing countries. Earnest Mercier has been very active in L'Ordre des agronomes du Quebec and the Agricultural Institute of Canada in addition to being very involved in the local church and several community committees.

From Whitehorse, Yukon to Québec

Let me first introduce myself, I am Chantal Mercier and I was born in La Pocatière, Qc. I moved to the Yukon five years ago. In fact I am in my fifth year. I teach basic french in an elementary school in Whitehorse. To be more precise I am the niece of Roland Mercier and daughter of Jean-Paul Mercier of La Pocatière. Lionel Mercier (the priest) is also my uncle. Uncle Roland was involved with ANAM, I believe, from the early days.

The present is to accompany a small gift, in occurrence a book on the Yukon written by François-Xavier Mercier. You will note certain orthographic differences in this book (Youkon, Clondike). This book recalls the Yukon pre-gold rush years of 1896-1897. It recalls the life at the time and the movement of persons in between Yukon and neighbouring Alaska. Other Merciers were there also (Moïse, François). It is purely historic and most likely valuable for your archives. According to the Alaska Historical Society, to whom I wrote, there would be two other books mentioning Francois Xavier Mercier; "Land of the Midnight Sun" and "The Last Frontier". I will try to consult them at the municipal library.

I enclose two articles published in 1987 in our french newspaper of Yukon "L'Aurore Boréale" on Francois Xavier Mercier. I draw your attention on the book's bibliography. There were other notes published on Francois Xavier.

I wish you good reading and good genealogy research. I hope this material will be helpful.

- a copy of no 2 (april 1991) volume 7 of "Le Mercien" in which Jeanne Mercier Depocas, granddaughter of Honoré Mercier and Virginie Saint-Denis, relates the history of her parents (Paul-Émile Mercier and Marie-Louise Juneau), first white canadians to be wedded under the tent in Whitehorse, Yukon, on june 28, 1901;
- a copy of our last published bulletin of l'ANAM (vol. 8 no 1, january 1992) in which I regroup by generations (for the second and third) the wedding of the descendants of the ancestral couple Charles Mercier known as Lajoie and Marianne Lahayse.

According to Pontbriand and Bergeron both genealogist, François Xavier Mercier, son of Joseph and Zoé Gauthier (wedded in Varennes (Ac on january 15th, 1855) is a grandson of François Mercier said Lajoie and Marianne Lahayse engaged june 18th, 1761 (Daguilhe contract) and wedded in L'Assomption june 21, 1761.

Remains to establish definite proof that Joseph son of Charles Mercier said Lajoie, married with Catherine Janot known as Lachapelle, daughter of Dominique and Marie-Rose Archambault, in Repentigny Qc, on november 17th, 1800. It is not an easy task. First, family names (patronymic) Mercier known as Lajoie and Janot (Jeannot) known as Bellehumeur were in fashion in the L'Assomption territory. Second, some parishes marriage registry of L'Assomption County were destroyed by fire.
