

Editorial

The 1998-1999 term was characterized by intense communication with the members and the Merciers of North America. The reading of the vice-president's report for the last financial exercise makes it evident.

I am pleased to substitute for Michel, our president, who has been unable to be with us on this occasion.

The board of directors has devoted time and effort at each meeting to OPERATION VISION 2000 aimed at consolidating our Association and stabilising its financial situation. We are greatly endebted to Senator Léonce Mercier for having made the whole effort possible.

The positive results of this campaign, although somewhat modest, are still benefiting the Association to-day.

We have been able to recover 7 former members who brought their status up to-date, recruit 17 new members and 2 lifetime members.

Another achievement which has contributed to give AMAN a greater visibility is the rearrangement of our web site. Important changes have been made and we are now on the same site as other family associations, at a lesser cost. Our host is now the "Centre de généalogie Francophone d'Amérique" which is a non-profit organisation sponsored by "La Société de Généalogie de l'Est du

Québec" and the Order of Notaries of Québec. Our web site address is simple: http://www.genealogie.org/famille/mercier. Many of our friends from New England have contacted us; we hope to translate the content of the material on our web site into English soon.

Early in the year, we have untaken to draw up an index of all articles published in *Le Mercien* since the beginning. This task is important and requires time and judgment to classify properly the different topics. Each article must be read and then classified according to an appropriate nomenclature. The information must then be computerized to become easily accessible. Dolores Morin has undertaken this important task, and she deserves our best appreciation.

During the year, the association has celebrated the 85th birthday of our founding president, Ernest. We are happy to see him devote so much time and effort to AMAN. May he continue for many years to come.

Our financial situation has improved over last year, our treasurer will deliver the details.



I have examined the statements of revenues and expenses as well as the balance sheet as at June 30th 1999. In my opinion these statements represent accurately the financial position of AMAN according to accounting procedures generally re-cognized and applied in the same ways as they were in the previous years.

Patrimoine familial / Family patrimony Trois-Rivières - Mortagne - Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré

English translation of the birth certificate of Marie Poulin written in Latin by the Jesuit Father Ragueneau

The same day of the same year. I have baptized Marie recently born of the father Claude Poulin and the mother Jeanne (Mercier). The godfather was D. Jacob Hartel and the godmother, Mrs. Marie Leneuf spouse of Mr. Jean Godefroy, all from the parish of Trois-Rivières.

Our maternal ancestor Marie Poulin is the daughter of Jeanne Mercier and Claude Poulin. She is born at Trois-Rivières before the first of January 1641. During that same year, the Poulin couple return to France with Marie, its new daughter. However, they come back to New France in 1648. So Marie, our first ancestral mother was one of the first canadian women to be educated in the original country of her parents.

In Québec, the wedding of Marie Poulin and Jullien Mercier took place on the 18th of January 1654. At that date, the young Marie stands out her thirteen years against the respectable Jullien who assures her of his 31 years of life. Jullien has, therefore, more than the double of Marie's age. After their marriage, father Ragueneau, missionnary for the Lower St. Lawrence Northshore has the certificate recorded in Notre-Dame-de-Québec and adds that they were solennelly married in the house of Robert Giguier (Giguère) at Sainte-Anne-du-Petit-Cap (Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré).


In 22 years, the Jullien and Marie couple is richer of ten children: six sons and four daughters. Their first daughter dies before one year of age. The ancestor Jullien passes out at 55 years. He leaves mourning a large family and a young spouse of some 36 years pregnant of twin daugthers After their father's death, the children, like bees, surrounds the queen of the home, their mother Marie Poulin, who knows how to take over with courage and devotedness not fearing to put her shoulder to the wheel to solve the problems. After 10 years of widowhood, she accepts Charles Monmainier's marriage propsal. The latter was a magnanimous father-in-law for his second wife's children. He showed consideration to the Mercier children as if they has been his own. Marie Poulin dies at some 76 years of age. She is buried in the Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré cemetery. The Mercier family is among the stock families which has buried the largest number of deads in the Saint-Anne-de-Beaupré cemetery.

Graines de santé / Health Seeds Food and cancer

Tea, a healty drink, may prevent several human cancers1

The tea coming from the leaves of *Camellia Simensis* is undergoing intense studies in North America. Scientific studies reveal that tea drinkers enjoy better health than other citizens.

In China, for example, tea dringkers were found to reduce by 60 percent their risks of having oesophagus cancer.

In Iowa (USA), a study involving more than 3 500 women has revealed that those who were drinking at least two cups of tea daily had 60 percent the risks of having bladder and kidneys cancers; and 32 percent less risks of suffering from oesophagus and colon cancers.

In the 1998 august member of the magazine *PREVENTION* (pages 104-109) the editor and nutritionist Holly McCord, RD, summarizes the results on tea reasearch done to that day. She compares a glass of tea to a vegetable broth. According to the studies underway at the Boston Tufts University, a cup of tea, green or black, contains more oxydizing power against our body free radicals — the peroxyl radical — than half-a-cup of brocoli, carrots, spinach, or strawberries.

Evidently, tea cannot replace vegetables. "Vegetables and fruits contain several substances (nutrients) which are not found in tea ", claim the

scientific workers Ronald Pior, PhD, and Guohua Cao, Ph D, in charge of the Boston experiments and studies.

Many people have doubts on miracle foods and cancer priventive agents in human beings. Let them express their personal convictions and wait for the results of research projects on tea.

While waiting for evidence, let us enjoy a cup of tea for its flavour. If scientific workers are wright, there is a profit in each cup of tea.

"If you are a woman past menopause with a family history of rheumatoid arthritis (RA), listen up: You may be able to slash your higher-than-average odds of getting RA by drinkling 3 or 4 cups of green tea a day."


According to scientific researchers polyphenols seem to close the door to dangerous inflammatory cells which migrate to the joints and generate rheumatoid arthritis.

Documents transmitted by sister Marie Mercier from Sherbrooke and condensed by Isabelle Mercier-Dufour

Le journal *La Trubune* présentait récemment un article de Mirielle Mercier de Johnville sur notre état de dépendance. Voici la réflexion de cette dernière sur le sujet.



Rural Architectural Patrimony

The ancestral home of Jean-Baptiste Mercier (6th generation) and Cécile Turgeon — my ancestors of the 6th Mercier generation in New France — is located on lot 316 of the local cadaster in the South East Range of St-Charles (Bellechasse). It is more than 225 years of age. It has undergone, during the last twelve years, considerable inside

and outside modifications. The examination of the two photos below: the first one taken in 1986 by Jacky Morrow and the second one by Paul-Émile Mercier in 1999, reveals the difference in the outlook of that nice farm house actually owned by Jean Mercier (11th G) and Lise Asselin.

We can see outside modern windows, vinyl clapboard on the walls, the rocking swing with its baldachin and the double garage in front of the house.

This house is one of second generation. The first habitation, probably made of peeled softwood logs, was on the right side of the Boyer River which constitutes the northern border of the local cadastral lot nomber 316. It seems that the first Mercier habitation traces back to the Cession Time (1760) when inhabitants of the seignories hided themselves with their livestock to prevent the british army from making use of them.
