### **Editorial**

To date, seven members have paid 1 000 \$ each to have their name on the honor roll of AMAN commanders. The president Pierre-Paul has unveiled their names and congratulated them at the Merciers' annual meeting held in Trois-Rivières on saturday august the 26th, 2000. The commander's register and certificate are in preparation. The honor roll will be included from now on in each number of *Le Mercien*.

At the Trois-Rivières gathering, members have asked questions regarding the benefits a **commander member** enjoy compared to a **life member**.

Most of the Mercier residences in North America — more than 8 000 — have received documents on the VISION 2000 of the financing campaign initiated by AMAN at the beginning of 1999. Summaries of that documentation are found in the Editorial of *Le Mercien*, volume 16, spring 2000. We, therefore, have on hand all what is need to make that financing campaign successful. We need many voluntary people ready to work for a small amount of money, — not to say symbolic,— hardly representing travelling expenses.

### Commander's privileges

AMAN's commanders enjoy eight privilages:

— Reduced entry fees at some activities — Automatic admission as life member — Granting of a special certificate — Free publicity at meetings — Photo and short biographical note published in *Le Mercien* — Name mentioned in each issue of the association's information bulletin — Free album souvenir (*Mercier depuis des siècles – Mercier for centuries*) — Free AMAN's badge — Membership in the Commanders' Board.

### Life member's privileges

Life members enjoy only three privileges:

- ◆ Annual dues paid forever;
- ◆ Obtention of a special certificate;
- → Having his or her name published once a year on the life membership list.

Cranting commander and lifetime membership titles (at the new rate) to Merciers and related is established to publicity recognize valuable efforts of those who are willing to stabilize the financial situation and assure the future development of our young family association.

The AMAN's board of administrators invite those who consider becoming life members — who will now have to pay after January 1st 2001, 250 \$ if they are 65 years and over and 400 \$ if they are younger — to pay, if they can, the difference between the above mentioned amounts and 1 000 \$ in order to become sustaining members and be classified as commander. The administrators are looking for voluntary Merciers and related to contact Mercier business people in order to invite them either:

- ◆ to become AMAN commanders;
- to contribute specific amounts of money as publicity subscribers in *Le Mercien* or sponsors of some AMAN's activities.

Our young family association needs additionnal funds to help younger and elder people to discover, develop and defend the ancestral patrimony in Canada and the USA. That is what compels AMAN administrators to assemble family associations requesting Income Canada to create a plurifamilial Foundation in order to develop the ancestral patrimony at the Québec, Canada and USA levels.

Thank you to those generous contributors. May their actions be followed by others.

In addition, Ernest, the founder of our association, has been awarded the title of honorary commander in 1999, on the occasion of his 85th birthday.

In total, our membership currently stands at 268 active members.

Since the beginning of the year 2000, many members have delayed sending their annual dues.

The main reason is that we have delayed sending our renewal notices for several months. This was due to our computer system which refused to recognize the year 2000.

We have had to update all our systems to the new millenium, and Benoit, our accountant, has been responsible to bring us back on board. He deserves our sincere thanks of his precious efforts.

Such an operation requires time, and has delayed the mailing of renewal notices early in the present year.

The cost of the operation amounted to 1,285., and it is the single most important factor of our operating loss of \$2,000. for the last financial year.

Therefore, we have to catch up with some delinquent members.

The best tool at our disposal to retain our members and recruit new ones is our quarterly publication, *Le Mercien*. We have made every effort to improve its contents and make it more interesting through publishing histories of Mercier families. We discover interesting people who have influenced their time and who might not have been known otherwise by other Mercier if their histories had not been published in *Le Mercien*.

For instance, in the Winter 1999 issue, we reported on the gathering of the family of Patrick Mercier and Marie-Anne Martel, we wrote on Marie Gelinas Mercier, Monique Mercier and champagne Mercier. In the Spring 2000 issue, we wrote about Linda Mercier and Real Frechette and published a letter from the Ottawa area about Gérard Mercier.

In the Summer 2000 issue, Eugene Mercier published his father's history and he came from Somers Ct. with his wife Dolorès to be with us to-day.

We appreciate the cooperation of such devoted members to bring us histories of Mercier families.

We still have material to keep on publishing, but we count on all of you to feed us the information.

Such has been the operation year that just ended, and we hope to have met your expectations.

We need volunteers to help us and the administrators and I invite you to let me know what are your talents or fields of interest. We will be pleased to feel your support.

I thank the members of the board who have supported me and we all thank you for your confidence throughout the year.

### Family Patrimony

At the Merciers' meeting in Trois-Rivières, participants have seen the commemorative plaque indicating the site of the first chapel were Marie Poulin was baptized on January 1st 1641. The present biographical note of Jullien Mercier's wife brings some precisions on Marie's life stages.

### Biographical note of Marie Poulin (1641-1716)

### Wife of Jullien Mercier (1621-1676)

1639	On August the 8 <sup>th</sup> of that year, Claude Poulin and Jeanne Mercier were wedded by Nicolas Adam, Jesuit, acting as Québec priest, in the Notre-Dame-de-la-Recouvrance church.
1641	Marie Poulin, daughter of Claude and Jeanne Mercier, born since some time, was baptized by Father Ragueneau, Jesuit, on January the first 1641. Shortly after that date, the small family went back to France.
1645 1646	Claude and Jeanne had two children who saw the light in Saint-Maclou (France):  ◆ Pascal born on February 16 <sup>th</sup> 1645,  ◆ Madeleine born on June 27 <sup>th</sup> 1646.
1647	Claude, Jeanne and their three children came back to New France and settled in Ste-Anne-du-Petit-Cap (today Ste-Anne-de-Beaupré) on a land concession (six arpents of frontage on the St.Lawrence River by one and half leagues in depth). The local hospital is on the estate conceeded to Claude Poulin.
1651	On October 15 <sup>th</sup> 1651, Jullien obtained a land concession (five arpents of frontage by one and half leagues in depth). His estate is on the east side of Robert Giguer (Giguère) concession where the Sainte-Anne Basilica is found to day.
1652	About one year after he had obtained his land concession, Jullien signed a marriage contract with Marie Poulin who was eleven and half years old.
1654	On January 18 <sup>th</sup> 1654, Father Ragueneau, Jesuit, solemly united them "in the home of Robert Giguier".
1676	After 23 years of marriage, Jullien died at the age of 54 years, on October 18 <sup>th</sup> 1676, when Marie was pregnant with twin daughters who were born four months later.
1682	At the age of 41 years and half Marie remarried Charles de Monmainier dit Jouvent on November 5 <sup>th</sup> 1682.
1716	On July 17 <sup>th</sup> Marie died at the age of 75 and half years.

In my opinion, these financial statements present fairly the financial position of the association, according to generally accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceeding year.

### The web

In our last issue, we invited readers interested in genealogy on the web to share with us the results of their findings as to which sites were interesting to explore.

So far, few of our readers shared their secrets with us. If we want this exchange to continue to be of interest, we need your input.

So far, two sites have been brought to our attention:

'www2.marianopolis.edu/quebechistory' and 'delisle.htlm'.

The two sites are exclusively in English.

The **first site** contains historical information on the migration of French-Canadians to the United States during the period 1840 to 1930, their survival in New-England, the Flint Affair, repatriation, the Franco-Americans, the Sentinel Affair and the Quebec Nationalism.

The **second site** contains the coats of arms of several families; however it is not all-inclusive. The name DeLisle is used as an exemple only. You may retrieve others through replacing DeLisle by another name. There might be a cost involved in obtaining a particular coat of arms. However we do not recommend that you make a purchase at this point. We are merely providing information.

There are other sites to visit. It would be interesting if we could only share their addresses.

The site address and the name of the person who submitted it will be published in the next issue of *Le Mercien*, with his or her consent.

# Entrepreneurial Heritage Founded by Gabriel Mercier (1914-2000)

The founder of three firms concerns still in operation today died on July 7<sup>th</sup> of this year.

They are: Assurances Gabriel Mercier Ltée, Meubles Mercier Ltée and Miroirs Laurier Ltée.

After graduating from Sainte-Croix College, Gabriel started a general insurance practice in Lyster, QC. In June 1937, he married Lucienne Olivier and carried his insurance business in the family home. The couple had three children: Jean-Luc in 1938, Claude in 1940 and Robert in 1942.

In 1945, with the assistance of his father Alcide Mercier, who operated a sawmill in Laurier Station, Gabriel incorporated Meubles Laurier Ltée, where he manufactured bedroom sets. The factory offices were located in Laurier, but Gabriel maintained his insurance practice just the same. He commuted every day between Lyster and Laurier.

During the Summer of 1950, he sold the family house and the insurance business of Lyster to his brother Gérard, but continued his insurance activities in his new home in Laurier where he moved in November.

The furniture factory started experiencing problems with the procurement of mirrors. Gabriel then decided to go into the mirror manufacturing business.

A few years later, Miroirs Laurier Ltée was supplying mirrors to other furniture factories in the area and throughout Québec. He continued operating the three businesses throughout the 1950's, which kept him very busy.

The three sons were in college. Gabriel waited till they obtained their university degrees before asking them to join him, Jean-Luc and Claude started in 1962 and Robert joined them a few years later.

Gabriel continued to be very active for several more years, until the three sons were in a position to take over. He was active until 1990 and then retired into Manoir Archer in Quebec City.

At last, he enjoyed a quieter way of life and he was in a position to devote more time to his family and friends, in spite of minor health problems.

He always enjoyed short visits to the office and often took friends along with him to share his pride for his factories.

Recently, his health deteriorated rapidly and he died on July 7<sup>th</sup> 2000, after a short illness.

Lady temperature had reserved one of its most beautiful day of the month for the afternoon visits to "Les Vieilles Forges" and the Pierre-Boucher Museum (The Trois-Rivières' Minor Seminary) where the ancient wedding dresses were simply gorgeous. At each of the two places we could have spent half a day to discover "a page of our history."
