

Development Fund

The creation of this fund was announced in the winter 2003 issue. The reasons for the fund were explained and a list of projects to be pursued was established as follows:

An introductory video on the arrival of the Merciers in America

- A genealogical index
- A consolidated index of *LE MERCIEN*
- A review of the past 20 years
- A monument at La Grandinière

Even though each of these topics has been discussed to some extent, to date three of them have been developed somewhat more.

The <u>video presentation</u> is partially completed but it is difficult at this time to forecast when it will be finalized;

Data continues to accumulate towards the publication of a genealogical index. This is the most demanding project; Benoît, Claudine and Robert are the members in charge of it. Harmonization of data collected and their distribution are yet to be finalized. This will be on the agenda for the next Board meeting.

The index of *Le Mercien* has been finalized, printed and is ready to sell. The intention to offer it for free to members has regrettably not been approved as yet. This will also be on the agenda for the next Board meeting.

The past 20 years review and the monument are currently on hold.

ESTHER MERCIER

DE BELLES PAROLES

Esther Croft. The name seems to perfectly suit this artist who weighs words and scrutinizes them to get their hidden meaning, because words can be misleading.

This is the name of a tragedian who defines herself in the books she writes. The last one is entitled *De belle paroles*.

But life is full of paradoxes; so, don't think you would be uncomfortable in her presence. At her home, on **rue** *des Érables*, one feels at ease. In the living room adjoining the dining room, where we are now, outside light abounds. Here and there impressive sculptures created by her daughter, Edith, catch your eye. In a corner, sitting on a pedestal, a large book also draws your attention

«Brouillons d'écrivains». It is a gift from her husband Ghislain, who acquired it from the *Très grande* Bibliothèque de France.

Esther Croft loves words. «Surely, words are the raw material of writing». Her novel, however, speaks of silence. Where does one start? Where do we find the words? More importantly, how do we use them with confidence? Starting on the first page, she asks herself how do we clean up silence?

How many times does that word turn up in the conversation... it's like a chorus, impossible to miss. When you ask her about it, she says « It took me a long time to master the language. I was a child of silence ».

A FIRST NOVEL

She has really caught up since then. She speaks slowly, quietly and it gives way to reflection. But once started, Esther can tell her life story as easily as the genesis of her novel. Up to the present, she has only published short stories, all well received by the critics. One of her books, *«Au commencement était le froid»*, earned her the Adrienne Choquette prize. «This time again, I had started to write a short story ».

The character of Catherine, a wife who has been cheated on, and who worked with aphasic people, was then created. « From there, it took a bigger dimension. I realized that I needed to dig deeper. Why aphasia? ». Thus, a short story turned into a novel.

Along the way, Esther realized that she was beginning to develop a theory that had long been on her mind « the paradoxical power of words ».

Catherine had been hurt by words, those of Marc-André Ladouceur, an unforgettable name when you consider his initials, M.A.L (which means EVIL). It was a reader who pointed out the coincidence of the word, the initials spelled out. Coincidence never occurs once. She came across a quote of Roland Barthe whose teachings she followed in Paris just before his sudden death in 1980: «Language as soon as it is spoken becomes a powerful tool». If she had known it, she would have put it as an epigraph to her book, because « that's really the subject matter of my book ».

A PUSH ON A SWING

Esther Croft grew up in Quebec City on rue Crémazie, then in Sillery. She went to good schools: Mérici, Institut Maria and College Notre-Dame de Bellevue, before studying teaching at Laval University where she received a diploma in theology. « My parents really believed in the education system, even for girls ». Her older sister, Lise, studied Social Service. You may remember a Carnival Queen named Lise Mercier. That's her. Her eldest brother, Jean-François, is a well known producer, and an associate of Lise Payette on *Point de mire*

She lived a worry free childhood, raised in a neighbourhood where culture was valued. Her

grandfather, J.-B. Mercier, was a business man in men's clothing. His store was in St-Roch, as is the case today too for Esther Croft's daughter, Marie-Chantal, and her partner, Éric Pelletier, who have their architects' office around there.

World travellers in an age when it took 13 hours to cross the Atlantic, the parents of the novelist gave her the taste to look elsewhere. The 16mm films

of their trips gave her a sense of already knowing Mount St-Michel, Paris, etc. So when her husband Ghislain, a senior civil servant at the Ministry of International Relations, was for the first time invited to work at the Quebec Delegation on rue Pergolèse, in Paris, she didn't hesitate to accompany him with their children. That was in 1973. They stayed there for five years. It was during a second stay that she studied with Roland Barthes and Hélène Cixous. She also attended for two years the writing workshops of Élizabeth Bing. On her return home, she was ready to expand her experience. Word of mouth did the rest.

Esther Croft currently directs four workshops. To her it's like « pushing a swing ». She suggests a subject, a writing way, but doesn't impose her thoughts, allowing everyone to express their own feelings. It also became a life style in the same way, she says, as writing and

teaching are, much as she did in creative literature or dramatic writing at Laval University.

We always get back to the words, to their importance... or to the unspoken... the family secrets. « I certainly had learned, says Catherine, that we must not try to look behind appearances, that silence is golden, and that what we don't know won't hurt us ». That is all wrong. Quebec keeps uncovering horrors: incest, child abuse cases. « When truth is hidden, notes the author, it's our perception of reality that is left in doubt ». And we are all the more vulnerable when we have every confidence in someone.

Esther Croft unveils all that in *De belles* paroles published at XYZ

Since the publication of this article, Esther Mercier has published short stories in 2007 Le reste du temps. For this latest work she as earned the prize for Creative literature recognized jointly by the City of Quebec and the International Book Salon of Quebec.

Esther Mercier is the daughter of Charles-Henri Mercier and Fleurette

Larochelle. She is the sister of Lise, one of the first Quebec winter carnival Queens, and of Jean-François, television producer.

Charles-Henri is the cousin of Father Bernard Mercier, redemptorist (179), and Jean Mercier (1)

I welcome you on behalf of my brothers and sisters. Also of Ernest, surely busy doing something useful up above, and of course of Marcelle who would want this day to be a happy occasion.

There are those people who radiate grace, elegance

and dignity. We see them in the theatre, imagine them in our dreams and mythology wallow in them. Marcelle was one of these without the celebrity status

Ernest was quickly enamoured by these elegant brunette who visited the college where he studied agriculture. She; amazed that he noticed her. I was not there, but I expect she watched him

from a distance, always flashing her irresistible smile. A marriage and 6 children later, there she was immersed in the realities of daily life where eagh chore was done with grace and elegance

Many of you will remember a special that Marcelle planned for hours and then prepared methodically with great care and... just in time. There was a specific knife for each function. The carrots were cut at angle, or cross cut or length***, onions were finely_sliced or chopped, and the broccoli was always served in a cluster. The recipe and proportion are essential to a princely welcome. When she served up an exceptional dish such as her

meringue, she usually saved a serving for someone missing. She had the gift to make everyone feel comfortable and realize that whatever they may have to say was important to her. She easily found in others what was attractive to her presence, Charm, reserve and kindness touched their hearth. Even that of the King of Morocco who tried to charm her all evening

Even the during the painful hours of her last days, Marcelle exuded her grace an dignity to those who tended to her. We have seen the hospital staff, where she was confined to bed,, step by and greet our mother even though she was not part of their duty care. She was in a way their princess, as they like to say

We have a fond memory of those last times with our mother- Right to the end she kept the same smile, same pleasant welcome and the same grace, qualities that we found in grand mother Normand and ahead were prominent among their descendants.

So goes life

On behalf of the family, thank you for being here for this last memorial to Marcelle.




Germain Nappert
