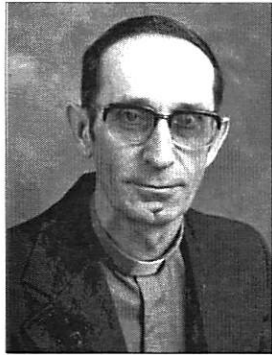

Arrivals: Bernard and Jean

Bernard (179) was born in Saint-Romuald in 1922. He is the son of Thérèse Labrecque and Albert Mercier. A sculptor of career, he is the author of many artworks, mainly in the Basilica of Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré, and also in many churches in the province of Quebec. The family is made up of five children, three of whom are religious.

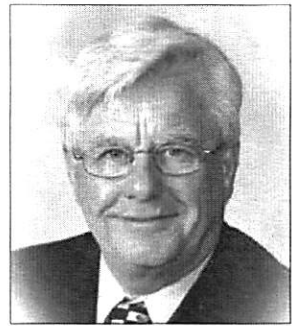


Bernard entered the seminary in 1935. He made his declaration of faith in 1943 and was ordained on June 26, 1949. He spent the first ten years of his career at the Redemptorists Fathers' *scolasticat* (preparatory seminary) in Aylmer, the first three years as a teacher of physics and the rest as an accounting clerk.

In 1961, he found himself at Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré, on the staff of the *Revue Sainte Anne* where, during 47 years, his administrative skills helped redress the magazine's worrying financial situation. He also adapted its content to the needs of families and increased its print run. He was an outright success and an excellent candidate for *Le Mercien*.

Father Bernard Mercier is a life member since the foundation of the AMAN in 1985.

Jean (1524) was born in Montreal in 1937, but found himself in Saint-Jérôme the very next year. He is the eldest of a family of five. His father exercised the profession of jeweller. He did his secondary studies in Saint-Jérôme as well as at the "Séminaire de Sainte-Thérèse", and then he joined the family enterprise.



The entrepreneurial spirit ran in the family. Jean's father, Charles Ed, bought a land in the Saint-Jérôme region in 1955. Five years later, he acquired the machinery to work on the site and an excavation company was born. It remained the property of the family until 1980.

But work is not everything; one needs also a social life. An Optimist Club was founded in Saint-Jérôme in 1968. Besides being the founding member, Jean became its second president, and in 1972-73, distinguished Lieutenant Governor. He also took part in the creation of about twenty clubs between Saint-Jérôme and the Témiscaminque.

Between 1980 and 1997, he was general manager for firms in the construction industry, real estate broker and developer, and from 1997 to 2009 he specialized in mortgage loan.

His interest in genealogy comes from an invitation he received from a friend who was founder and president of the "Société de généalogie des Laurentides" to update data related to the Mercier family. Since January 2010, he lives the free life of a retired person: volunteer work and the AMAN.

Jean was married to Johanne Martin (now deceased) and is the father of two daughters, and grandfather of three granddaughters. He is a member of our association since 2008.

Merciery of all kinds

The author sincerely wishes to thank Suzanne, daughter of Marcel, for her collaboration in the writing of this article.

With him, we are not out of the wood. Having dedicated a big part of his life to develop a company of wooden floor, to innovate to put in market a pre-finished product, to give the succession of **Planchers Mercier** to two of his children, Marielle and Richard, here he is now in the creation of miniature constructions to realize a small marvel, **Marcel Mercier's miniature villages**.

Planchers Mercier (Mercier's floors)

Marcel Mercier's adventure was successively home-made and industrial. He began in the early fifties to make them in his basement, then in a workshop located behind the family house, under the company name of *Ameublement Mercier*, various products such as: kitchen panels, tables for sewing machine, etc. for factories of the region.

One day, he received a particular demand of his wife Jeannette Leclerc suggesting to him, for the wooden floor, to varnish boards in his workshop and to put them one by one rather than to make it the conventional way with all the dust and the smell of the varnish.

A woman's will is God's will and Marcel do...

The result of this innovation aroused such an interest with his customers on whom Mr. Mercier decided to push farther his researches and in 1980, Marcel manages after multiple variable successful attempts to finalize a manufacturing process of small strips of pre-finish hard wood in factory endowed with a big wear resistance, with no obligation for the buyer to submit himself to unpleasant works of varnishing.

This success pulled the construction of a ultra

modern factory ultra in the industrial district of Montmagny where the wooden floor of multiple texture and a many variety of tints are made for the Canadian, American, European markets and the certain Asian countries.

But what exactly do Marcel now that he is a young retired at the end of his sixties? Now that he has passed the wheel of the enterprise to his children?

The miniature villages of old times

On a trip to the *Village québécois d'antan*, he discovers a guide of initiation to the manufacturing of houses in miniature and here we are once again...

As soon he return home, he began his work and to resume the result of all his years of hobby to his new passion, there is nothing better than the description of the web site dedicated to him.

"The summer Village, the first model which our craftsman put in construction site following his inspirante visits, illustrate in its human and fastidious way the everyday life in rural Quebec of the beginning of the XXth century" with its wooden pavements, as if they still existed there in Montmagny in 1945", tells Mr. Mercier. "

"Occupying a vast room of the workshop, this village groups includes multiple characters who bustle cheerfully around about sixty buildings in the scale: houses, church, general store, park and the other buildings of various time periods. Twenty-six buildings are inspired by the *Quebecois Village d'antan*. Others, added afterward, reproduce the heritage the of Côte-du-Sud with a wealth of



outstanding details, like the Paton mill (today converted in condominiums).” To reproduce the walls of the mill, I had to cut 3000 small wooden blocks, then I added eight coats of paint... ”

The “oldest” houses of this village, finally, “date” the environment of the XVIIIth century. But there is a case of exception which becomes integrated nevertheless very well into the set: the house of Marcel Mercier, built of course by the hands! ”

“So impressive, stuffed with the short histories inspired by historic facts, the Winter village took its definitive shape in autumn, 2002.”

“This second model is exposed in another room of the workshop. It redraws the life in forest of our first inhabitants, the Amerindians. Even there, Marcel Mercier depicts with an outstanding accuracy the everyday life of his corner of country in the beautiful but hard time of our ancestors.”

“The series of blocks of images which follows (in the web site) shows in detail the colorful work with its spectacular panorama, a creation of the painter Sara Chamard, Saint-Jean-Port-Joli. Among others photos:” aerial photos “and” zooms” on buildings, elements of decoration and the characters ”, photos realized by mister Jean Cazes!

“Besides his major components that are his Villages summer and of winter, Marcel Mercier exposes in his workshop other works, such as the Village of Christmas, the models of the houses of his children and his Alley of the Craftsmen”, inspired this last one of the street of Petit-Champlain in Quebec.

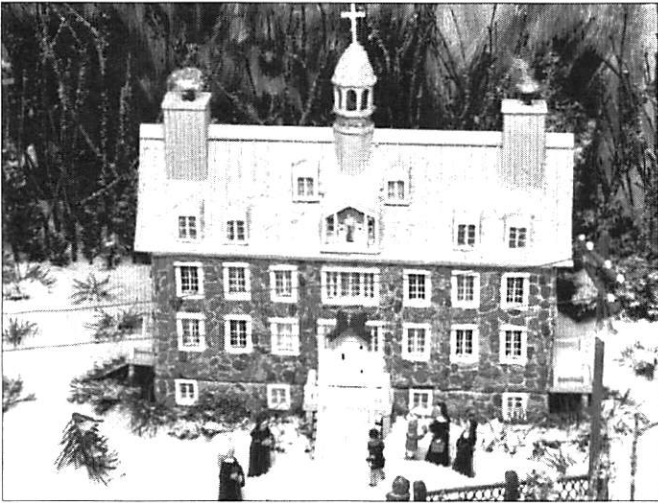
And here we are, another Mercier family of which we can only be proud and which deserves all our admiration.

Suzanne Mercier a Righteous among the Nations

Mr. Jacques Carl Morin has kindly sent us the following text about Suzanne Mercier who, thanks to her dedication, saved the life of a Jew during the last world war. A big thank you for this interesting piece of information.

Did you know that Suzanne Mercier is one of the 1011 Righteous among the Nations of France?

In 1953, the State of Israel, through legislation, has created the honorary title Righteous among the Nations. The Righteous were defined as non-Jews who risked their lives to save Jews in occupied Europe.

During an official ceremony conducted by a Jewish diplomat, a medal in their name is awarded to the Righteous persons, or to their next-of-kin if they are nominated posthumously. The commemorative site of Yad Vashem in Jerusalem contains thousands of trees. Each of them is marked by a plaque bearing the name of a Righteous person. These trees, planted by the Righteous themselves or by their next-of-kin honor the memory of the men and women without whom nobody would have survived to build Yad Vashem.

The names of the Righteous among the Nations of France are also engraved on the “Mur des Justes” (Wall of the Righteous) in Paris.

At the beginning of the occupation, Suzanne Mercier lived with her daughter in an insolated farm in *Argent-sur-Sauldre*, her husband, a war prisoner, was in Germany.

Régine Haber got acquainted when she came several times, with her daughter Dora, to visit her husband, imprisoned not far from there, in Cerdon, into the camp GTE (Group of immigrant workers) of Matelotte where from he was deported towards the east camps to never return.

In January, 1944, pursued, they came to ask for asylum to Suzanne Mercier who found them a refuge in an abandoned nearby farm. She has also hide two other women, one of them was Fanny Appel and their children in a hut in the forest. She brought to her protégés some products of the farm which allowed them to survive.

Suzanne Mercier received the Medal of the Just men, in 1989. "

Noëlla Laliberté and Réal Mercier... 65^e Wedding Anniversary

It was on September 21, 1945 that Noëlla Laliberté and Réal Mercier got married. Both natives of Saint-Henri-de-Lévis, they settled in Quebec City, in the Saint-Sauveur neighbourhood after their wedding. Réal worked there as a butcher for more than forty years.



An interesting article written by Alain Bouchard was published in issue No. 4, Vol.19 of the newsletter *Le Mercien*. It describes the dedication and volunteer work of Réal (undoubtedly with the understanding and full cooperation of Noëlla), which earned him the Governor General's Caring Canadian Award in 2003.

The couple has four children: Gaëtan, Dorys, Claude and Carole, seventeen grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

Réal is a member of the AMAN since the beginning (120).

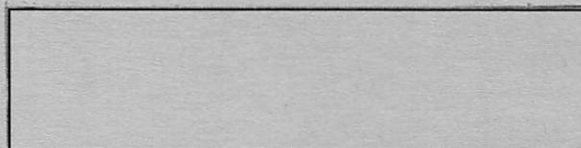


