

The life of Pierre-Paul Mercier

Born into a working class family based in heart of the Plateau, and angle Parthenais Mont-Royal, the young Pierre-Paul, an only child, found in numerous cousins, the companions of his childhood. Indeed, there are seven uncles / aunts in Mercier and eighteen on the maternal side, the Laurin.

His mother intended to special education for a middle child: primary school in a religious and classical studies at Holy Cross Classic Externat Sherbrooke Street.

From his eighteenth year, to fill his summers, Pierre-Paul is participating in a training program for officers in the Canadian Armed Forces. He eventually gets a rank of captain. Assigned to the military camp in the small town of Farnham in the Cantons de l'Est, he met his future wife Carmen Dupont. The marriage takes place in Farnham May 31, 1958. It must be said that the stepmother was a foregone conclusion: it was she who introduced the young lovebirds to each other!

Pierre-Paul continued his studies at the Ecole des Hautes Etudes Commerciales and became a chartered accountant. Recruited by a firm of accountants, he accepted a position as auditor.

Hôpital Jean-Talon, while looking for a chief financial

officer, is for the firm to fill the position. Pierre-Paul is engaged and then he will assume the management of finance at the University Hospital of Sherbrooke and the Montreal General Hospital. He worked for over twenty years in the health care system, until the late 1980s.

It was during the sale of the duplex rue Bossuet lives and the couple shares with their first-born Benedict, for the move to Sherbrooke in 1968, Pierre-Paul grabs the bite of real estate. It starts with investing in a first apartment building.

The family returned to Sherbrooke a few years later with a second child, Marie-Claude, and settled in Saint-Lambert in suburban Montreal, where Peter Paul and Carmen were still residing on the death of the latter.

He invested over the years in several buildings, passion sets the stage for a second career. In 1982, he first offers of property management services. Following his departure from the health care system, he began brokering real estate. It is self-employed until his retirement in 2008.

Over sixty, Pierre-Paul looks at the history and genealogy. He has been first to establish his lineage Mercier and published his first book on its origins, and Napoleon Mercier Alphonsine Chartier 1557-1998. This work led him to volunteer at the Genealogy Club of Longueuil and in AMAN.

He remains physically active, with whom he plays tennis every week for thirty years, and reviving a happy youth cycling. Less loaded his schedule also allows it to engage in the practice of golf. Travel is the appointment, his wife and himself had traveled to Europe several times with carefully routes established by Pierre-Paul. La dolce vita cruise ship also allows him to relax on occasion.

His last years were devoted to genealogical research and publishing a second book on her mother's family this time, titled Toussaint Laurin and Celina Bougret-Dufort, Family Album 1655-2010. His two grandchildren, Daniel and Sophie will one day see a wealth of information on their origins in the works

bequeathed by imposing their grandfather.

True to his alma mater, Pierre-Paul maintains over the years relations with the former Holy Cross, now the College Maisonneuve. As president of the Alumni Association, he oversees the publication of a history of the college and create scholarships for students of the College Maisonneuve, one will be known as the Stock Exchange of Pierre-Paul Mercier Alumni Association of St. Croix.

The route of Pierre-Paul ended on February 13 after a hard fight against lung cancer. He was 76.

The role of a father is traditionally the livelihood and discipline, but the role of my father who marked me the most was that of advisor.

Throughout my life my father was a resource person for me, either for help with homework (I remember the sessions in algebra very difficult at the start) for my university management (if you like physics, but you do not want to become a teacher by graduating, do engineering) for financial advice (savings, budget, investments, etc.). His experience in the business I have been awfully helpful throughout my career whether for how to write a letter of job application, how to negotiate a raise or how to deal with difficult people at work.

It was also in the space of one month in 1987 I entered the job market after graduating, and that he was retiring from the Montreal General Hospital following a merger with the Royal Vic. This retreat was not a work stoppage - quite the contrary - but rather the beginning of a second career for him. Indeed, after investing in real estate for several decades, he ran head-on in managing and selling real estate, which he practiced until two years ago.

It taught me that life does not stop at retirement but it's an opportunity for a change of direction or any renewal. It also showed me that we must stay active mentally and socially - not to mention physically - in order to fully enjoy life As you get older.

This second career for me was also a manifestation of certain values that father had very promptly - the work ethic, to be conscientious and diligent hard even in the pursuit of a goal - and he taught me. I apply these values to work and also some aspects of my personal life.

The importance of education was another value that I passed, and he tried to convince my son also, even if it sometimes it warmed the ears. My father was born to a working class family in Montreal's east end - his father was a tram driver and bus and his mother was a housewife - but he had the chance to make his classical studies with financial assistance from the family. I think this experience has marked and has always wanted to do well whether at school or work because of the chance he received.

A passion that was shared genealogy. I became interested when my son was born, and that's when my father had revealed that there was also interested shortly after my birth. He began to draw a family tree by talking with family members, but was arrested in the generation of his grandfather. I resumed the search for a few years by visiting cemeteries and special libraries during my visits to Montreal, but he finally managed to find our ancestors and who moreover wrote two books about it. Her love for genealogy and history led him to become involved as a volunteer in the genealogical and cultural associations - either as president of the Association of Mercers of North America or as a board member of the old college Ste-Croix.

My father was also a lover of good food and good wines, but also had a soft spot for digestive (calvados, apple of burgundy, Mandarin Napoleon, etc.).. I remember many Sunday dinners at the restaurant, where each chose a different dish so we can all taste it. I forwarded the openness to try something new to my children culinary point of view, but I'm also used throughout my life in different situations. Another lesson I learned from my father.

Now my father is gone, but he passed the torch with which I have in my turn inform my family.

A Generous and fructuous Career... André Mercier

André (189) is a member of AMAN since its founding in 1985 by Ernest and his commitment to both the AMAN and among its citizens was constant. A few weeks ago he decided to take early retirement very well deserved. We wish to remind the main steps of a rich career.

The "Magnymontoises" Years

André was born in Montmagny August 6, 1929. He is the son of Honoré Mercier and Antoinette Laurendeau. Married to Lucille Létourneau, he is the father of Francois and Louis and two small son, Frederick and Felix.

Following college at Sacred Heart College in Montmagny, he enrolled in various courses related to administration and communication.

In the following years, he worked for the Quebec Power, will be director of the station and President of Alleghenies Radio CKBM Inc., owner of the station.

During this period André has been involved in various community activities such as a) Secretary of the Junior Chamber, b) Director and secretary of the Chamber of Commerce and the Regional Montmagnt, c) President of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul de Saint-Mathieu, d) Director of the supervisory board of the credit union Saint-Mathieu, e) Chair of the Lions Club, f) the Club Business, g) radio advertising director of the Red Cross in the county of Montmagny, h) Chief Information Officer of the municipal emergency of Montmagny i) Director and Secretary of the Economic of Montmagny.

In recognition of more than deserved, the mayor of Montmagny Jean-Claude Croteau, gave him during the evening of the builders, as part of the festivities of the 350th anniversary of the Lordship of Rivière-du-Sud June 20 1996, the Medal of the builder.

But we can not ignore that in circumstances still too frequent these occupations have drawbacks which it would rather do without. Our thanks go to André for Lucille, and they are well deserved.


