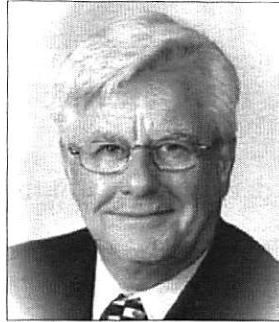
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Word from the President

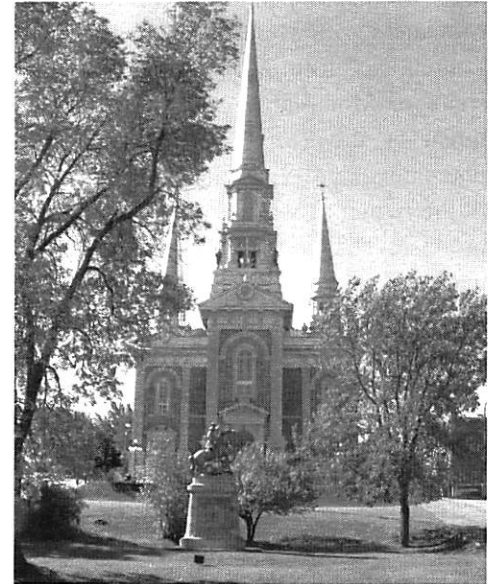

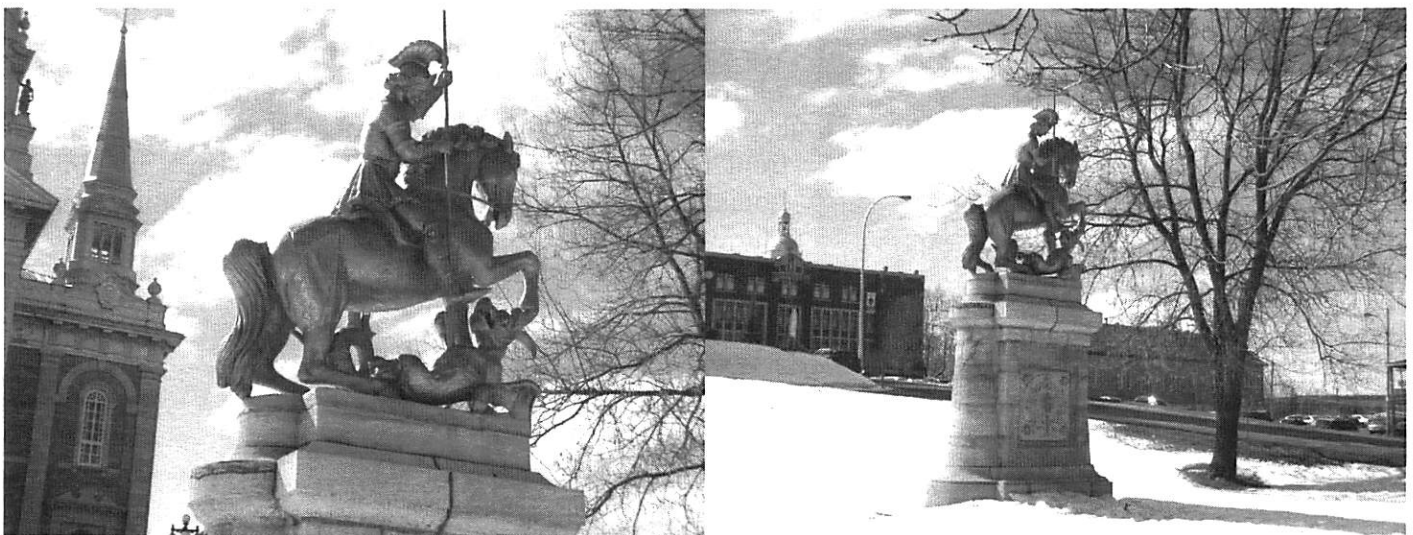

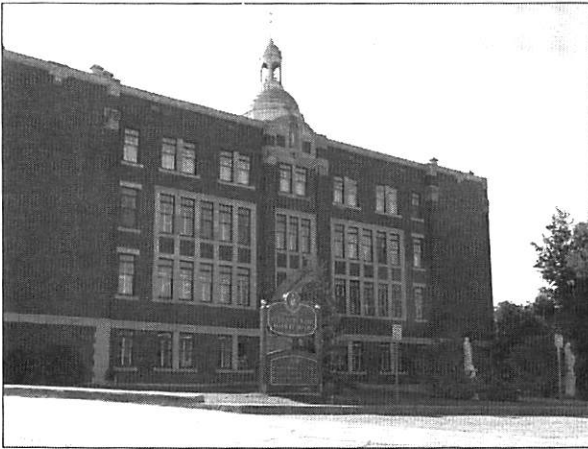

City of St-Georges is the largest city in the Beauce with over 30,000 inhabitants. Located in the Chaudière-Appalaches region, 100 kilometers south of Quebec, it is located on the banks of the Chaudière River. Metropolis of the kingdom of SME, St-Georges offers visitors many attractions both natural and cultural. The territory of the city was first occupied by the Abenakis that identify the Chaudière River by the word of Méchatigan: River touchy or unpredictable. The German Pfötzer John George, fourth Lord of Aubert Gallion, is considered the true founder of the parish of St. Georges. Isolated for a long time, the Beauceron has developed a spirit of independence and resourcefulness that characterizes the region today.

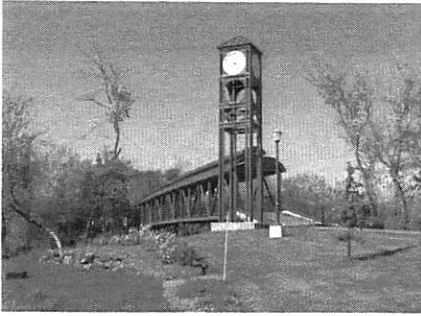

The Domaine de la Seigneurie

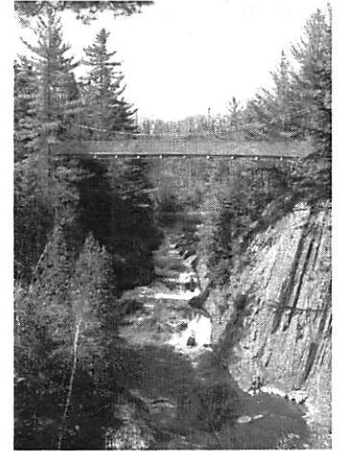

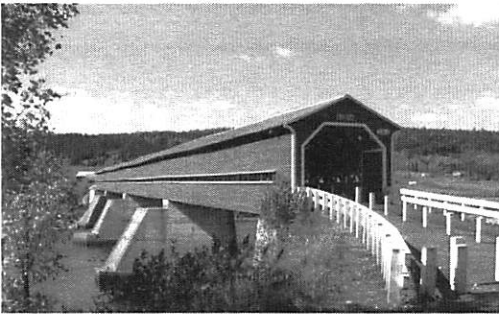
The Sept-Chutes Park

Cover Bridge Perrault

The covered Perrault's Bridge in Notre Dame des Pins is the longest covered bridge in Quebec and the second longest in Canada. Moreover, it is an historical monument by the Ministry of Culture and Communications of Quebec. Gateway to the bike path "Black Hock Trail" a tourist rest area and has been carefully arranged to welcome you to the site of the covered bridge. It includes tables for your outdoor meals, games for children, health services in addition to the bike hire on site.

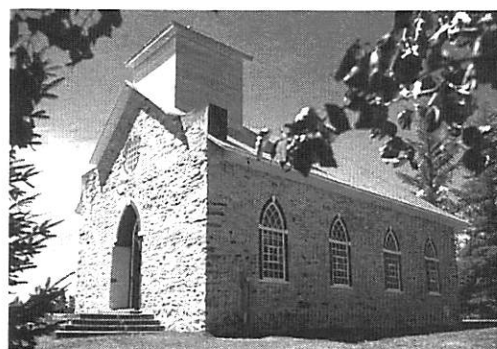

The origin of the Merciers in Beauce

In the edition of the Mercien of Fall 2011, the historian André Garant says Augustin Mercier and his wife Félicité Boucher, married in Saint Joachim de Montmorency in 1772, settled a year later in Beauceville. They then occupy the land at the bottom of the current Gulf Coast Beauceville Kennedy on the road. According to research by Michel Cliche, Augustin is the first to inhabit the Beauce Mercier. It is the fourth generation of the ancestral couple Julien Mercier and Marie Poulin settled in Sainte-Anne de Beaupré.

Julien and Marie had three son who continued the tradition of Mercier or Pascal, Jean and Pierre. This is Peter, who married Marie Chamberland April 5, 1717 in Sainte-Famille on Île d'Orléans, just as we strain that colonizes the Beauce. Pierre's son, Joseph, wife Josephite Caron at St. Anne de Beaupré January 22, 1748. They are the parents of the future Beauceron Augustine.

The couple have three Felicite Augustine and son, two, and son Paul Augustin-Olivier dual contract a marriage with Suzanne Doyon and Cecile respectively Bureau in St. Joseph October 21, 1800. Born of such marriages Mercier many who settle mainly in Saint-François (Beauceville) and St. Joseph. Subsequently, the descendants of this line go to St. Mary, St. Elzear, St. Ephrem, St. Victor and St. Benjamin.

For the municipalities of Saint-Honore, St. Gedeon, St. Martin and St. Ludger, it's always the offspring of Julian, but the side

of Pascal. These Mercier settled in St. Vallier de Bellechasse and the Isle of Orleans. The couple's most prolific, Prudent Mercier and Agathe Lacroix, get married Jan. 7, 1840 at St. Anselm. Of the nine children of this union, eight were married at St. Honoré and St. Gédéon and one in St. Martin.

Some descendants of the ancestral couple Charles and Marianne Mercier said Lajoie Lahaise inhabit the center of the Beauce and Saint George. Their ancestor Louis left of the Assumption, in the Montreal area, to raise a family in Sainte-Justine de Bellechasse. It is one of the founders of the 92nd Regiment of Dorchester who would later become the Régiment de la Chaudière,

Saint-Georges, the first marriage recorded is that of Mercier and Apolline Louis Paquet November 20, 1860. They have two son, Elzéar who married Rosalie Létourneau, April 20, 1891, Napoléon and Caroline Rainville August 27, 1907. One son, Horace, wife Cédée Landry, St. Prosper February 27, 1935. 95 Mercier appear in the phone book of the 2012 Greater Saint-Georges. Can be estimated between 200 and 300 the number of Mercier who inhabit this part of the Beauce.

Ralph Mercier receive the medal of the National Assembly

Medal of the National Assembly is given by a member of a deserving individual of his choice. Receive this award from the hands of the representative of his constituency or Charlesbourg, is obviously a recognition of quality and when the member in question is Michel Pigeon, former rector of Laval University, there is a great recognition.

Mr. R. Mercier did not really need an introduction. However, we reproduce the text published in the weekly Charlesbourg Express of March 21, 2012 under the signature of Denis Fortin

So as to highlight its work done over the last 30 years with the community charlebourgeoise, MPP Charlesbourg, Michel Pigeon, presented March 19 at Ralph Mercier Medal of the National Assembly of Quebec.

The recipient of the medal began his public career in 1980 as president of the Regional School Board John? Talon. Four years later he was elected mayor of Charlesbourg, a position he held continuously until amalgamation in 2001.

He subsequently was elected alderman for the new Québec City near Charlesbourg Centre, since the area became the Trait-Carré. He held this position until 2009, when he retired from politics. During this period, he was President of the Borough of Charlesbourg and executive committee member of the City of Quebec.

He was also involved at the provincial level within the Union of Municipalities of Quebec, in various positions, including president from October 1990 until April 1993. He also served on the Board of Directors and the executive of the union as representative of the caucus of big cities.



Finally, he chaired the Quebec Urban Community as well as numerous professional associations, social and community.

"For all these reasons, Ralph Mercier was a perfect candidate to receive the Medal of the National Assembly of Quebec," said Michel Pigeon.

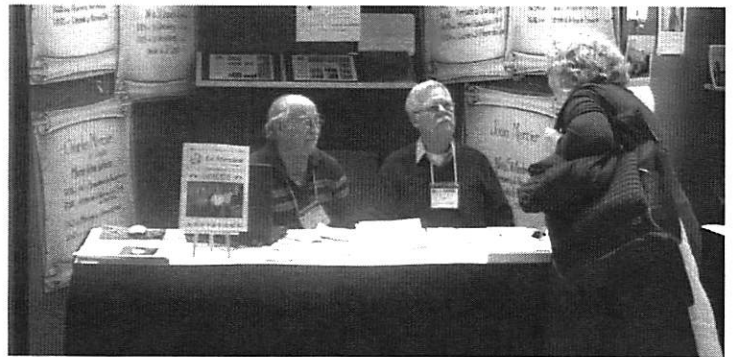

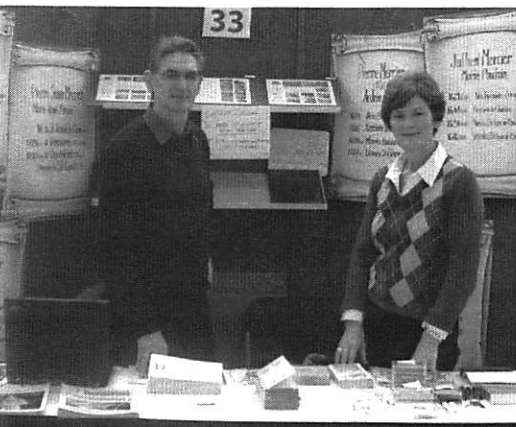
